From April 2013 housing benefit has been decreased for people who live in council housing or housing association properties that have more bedrooms than the government think they require.

This means a couple living in a house with two bedrooms, or a couple with one child but three bedrooms have had their housing benefit reduced by 14%. This is called the "under occupancy charge", but some people have referred to it as a "bedroom tax".
