


Figure 1: Presidential Vote Preference – Registered Voters




Figure 2: Obama Approval - All Adults




Figure 3: Obama Approval - Registered Voters




Figure 4: Congress Approval – All Adults




Figure 5: Congress Approval – Registered Voters




Figure 6: Direction of Country - All Adults




Figure 7: Direction of Country - Registered Voters




Figure 8: Congressional Vote Intention – Registered Voters
