Abdelbaset al-Megrahi was convicted of the Lockerbie bombing in 2001 and sentenced to life imprisonment. In 2009 he was released from prison and returned to Libya on compassionate grounds, as he had been diagnosed with terminal cancer and doctors thought he had only a short time to live. He is currently still alive and living in Libya.

Some people have called for al-Megrahi to be returned to Britain to complete his sentence. Others have called for him to be sent to the USA to face trial for Lockerbie in the American courts. Other people think his ill-health means he should be left free on compassionate grounds.
